## MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

### SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- SSC 306 is a prerequisite for ADV 344K and 345J. This course also satisfies the 3 hour mathematics requirement in the core curriculum. Students must earn a C or better.
- A grade of B or better is required in ADV 318J to continue in the Public Relations program. Students have only two chances to make a B.

## NATURAL SCIENCE, PART II

Three (3) hours in a discipline other than that used to fulfill the Part I requirement. Any course listed for Natural Science Part I may be counted. In addition, any of the following courses may be counted:

- Biology (BIO) 301C, 343E, 305F, 486D, 347D, 349D, 349F
- Computer Science (C S) 302; 307
- Geography (GEO) 301C, 341K, 344E
- Mathematics courses at the level of Mathematics 302 or higher, excluding courses used to fulfill the mathematics requirement.
